- 1. Vote on Fund Disposition Options:
 - Allow them to keep the money regardless of reporting
 - Require them to submit a final report form and offer the opportunity to extend their project timeline (for an amount of time that we choose)
 - Rollover monies cannot be used for our own projects or administrative costs
 - If grantees extend their projects from last year, they cannot apply for the same project (no double-dipping)
 - We can encourage grantees to host virtual events or have a virtual back-up option
 - Motion: Ask all grantees for a final report. If they have not finished the funded project, they should ask us for an extension until December 2021. Motion passed unanimously.
 - Motion: They cannot apply for the same project for FY2021. Motion passed unanimously. Rachel is happy to draft message to grantees
- 2. Expect to hear about state funding in November, but grant period will be conducted as scheduled.
 - We need to update priorities. Rachel will look into that.
 - Things to include in advertising:
 - Encourage applicants to have a virtual back-up plan. Offer help if they don't. MCC probably has advice on their website. We should share that with applicants.
 - 2. Encourage applicants to make sure as many people as possible can participate (grants should be for the public benefit).
- 3. Minutes from September 15: approved unanimously.
- 4. Reminder that we need to decide prior to grantmaking how much we are setting aside for administrative costs (up to 5%) and our own project (up to 15%).
- 5. Publicity: Angela will send out press release for community survey and grant application.
