The Stow Recreation Department and "**Recreation for Stow**" group makes a request to Community Preservation Committee for \$600,000 in funds for sports fields, potentially at Pine Bluff or Snow property. The Stow School Building Taskforce Community Forum presents alternatives for the new school, and the "**Question & Answer**" session provides more information. **Selectmen meetings** are shown live and rerun. Stow playwright Marika Barnett wrote "**The Eleventh Hour.**" The play was produced at Newton Local Access TV, and they provided the DVD. Shirley Farmer presented slides of "**Holland in Bloom**" at the Council on Aging.

"**Sounds of Stow Winter Concert**" is featured. The "**Finance Committee Public Hearing**" reviews and listens to input on all the warrant articles to be voted on at Town Meeting. FinCom makes recommendations on each article based on topics discussed at this meeting. The "**Lake Boon Association Annual Meeting**" considers a proposal for treatment to control the weeds in the lake, and septic pumping to minimize the amount of nutrients getting into the water and feeding the weeds. "**Recreation for Stow**" presents a proposal for developing a recreational center at Pine Bluff/Town Beach. "**Ancient Stow History**" can be discerned from the artifacts still found in the land around Stow. For example, recent findings at the Pine Bluff area suggest a thriving Indian community lived there. "**Traces of the Ancient Past: Native American Archaeology of the Sudbury/Concord/Assabet River Basin**" was sponsored by Stow Historical Society and the Stow Historical Commission. A new "**School Building Taskforce Question and Answer**" session provides more information about the scenario that will be recommended at Town Meeting. The "**Selectmen Meeting**" considers School Building plans, whether to purchase Collings property, a Freedom's Way Landscape Inventory, and Town Meeting warrant articles.


