 - Funding from state is unclear, but not expected until end of October.
 - We need to set priorities for the year, but it makes sense
 - Grant deadline is supposed to be November 15, but we likely cannot open up the process until state budget is allocated.
 - Rachel will double check about extensions for 2020 projects which have not yet been completed. MCC has said that we do not need to reclaim those funds. Rachel will confirm with Julie about remaining town funds that have been disbursed, but not used. Rachel will reach out to each grantee.
 - Angela will create a flyer for the call for grant applications
 - Publicity same as previous years.
