<u>Qualifications</u>: Two at-large members must be residents or business owners in the Town of Stow. Preference will be given to those who reside in Lower Village, as well as those with relevant organizational representation, advocacy experience or interest in one or more of the following areas:

- Economic/Business Development
- Housing
- Community Planning

Term: 1-year term, renewable annually, to serve through August 2022.
