
MAI will be the first fully-integrated Sports Academy in New England, serving 500+ students across 10+ sports and academic majors for grades 6-12

INVESTMENT OVERVIEW

- We have signed a purchase and sale agreement with the targeted closing date of November 18, 2021. After renovating office space into residential dorm rooms, MAI will open to students for the 2023-2024 school year.
- MAI will cost approximately \$45 million, including the initial purchase of the property for \$11.3 million, all construction costs (including conversion of office space to residential dorm rooms), appropriate contingencies, pre-opening, and startup costs all fees and expenses. Our goal is to secure at least \$20 million in debt financing with the remaining equity commitments. The equity is expected to be drawn down over time as needed.
- The school is expected to be a strong free cash flow generator; our financial model makes conservative debt assumptions that prioritize early debt repayment and enhanced financial flexibility. Our Base Case generates attractive returns with the model reflects Internal Rate of Returns of 30%+ and Multiple of Equity Invested of 4.0x+.

MASTERS ACADEMY - INITIATIVE LEAD/SCHOOL FOUNDER

Peter will serve as a Director for Admissions and Recruitment and will also oversee the sports division for Masters Academy International.

Peter is currently the owner, in partnership with his brother Chris, and director of all of Junior Bruins (www.bosotnjuniorbruins.com) operations. After graduating from Boston College in '97 with a B.S. in communications, where he was a four-year letterman on the varsity hockey team, Peter played professionally with the Dayton Bombers in the East Coast Hockey League after college and took over the Junior Bruins in 1999. Peter has been running the Junior Bruins organization ever since and was joined by Chris in 2000. During that time the organization has grown into one of the premier amateur hockey companies in all of North America. Peter coached the top junior team in the organization for over 17 years and for the last four years has been exclusive overseeing growth and day to day operations of all Junior Bruins businesses. During that time he had been named coach of the year three times and his teams have won the regular season and playoff titles many times during his tenure. He is directly responsible for creating the top tournament series in the U.S. (www.beantownclassic.com) and currently sits on the executive committee of the largest youth hockey league in North America (www.usphl.com). The Unites States Premier Hockey league has over 11,000 players participating in the league and has over 170 youth organizations under its umbrella.

Chris will work with his brother Peter Masters as Director of Admissions and Recruitment, as well as directing Masters Academy International's sports division.

Chris is also the Program Director for Junior Bruins Hockey. He joined the staff as a head coach and coordinator of all Bruins camps during the 2000 season. In his 16 years coaching his teams have won National Championships, league titles and dozens of tournament championships. He had 70+ of his players go on to play Division 1 College with, play for the US-NTDP and some playing in the NHL. He created the programs spring/summer AAA tournament program that has grown to one of the best in North America. He founded the Brick series events that include tournaments in Nashville, Las Vegas and Los Angeles. He created the Boston Showdown, which is the top youth AAA spring tournament in Boston. Chris graduated from Boston College in 1999. He played on the hockey team at BC and was a captain his senior year. His junior and senior years the team won back-to-back Hockey East titles and advanced to the 1998 and 1999 Frozen Fours.

Ted Meekma's 30+ yr. career parallels the evolution of the sports camp business into the sports academy industry. He was a Bollettieri tennis coach when the now legendary Nick Bollettieri Tennis Academy (NBTA) opened in Sept. 1978. In 1983, Ted earned his law degree, brought his successful coaching career to a close, and became the Executive Director of the NBTA.

In 1987, he co-negotiated the sale of the NBTA to sports management giant IMG. For the next 21 years, Ted would play a crucial role in the growth and development of what eventually became IMG Academy, the word's #1 commercial, multi-sport, training and education, camp and academy. When he left the Academy in Dec. 2008, it was as Senior Vice President IMG and Director IMG Academies. He formed Ted Meekma Consult, LLC in early 2009. Its mission is to provide commercial sports facility, programming, marketing and operational consultation to a select number of U.S. and international clients.

In 2014 Rich created Heads Up Educational Consulting LLC which works with over 300 private schools around the world providing governance, leadership and strategic planning, new school design, development and ongoing support, helping schools merge, separate or close and working with Boards of Trustees.

Between 1976 and 1989 Rich served independent schools as: Director of Development, Business Manager and Director of External Affairs. These schools ranged in student size from 50 to over 1,200, boarding, day or boarding/day, elementary through PG (Post Grad) attracting students from over 90 countries.

EDUCATION OVERVIEW - FOUR PILLARS

- Academics Deliver boarding and day students a fully accredited, college preparatory academic curriculum utilizing collaborative, cross curricular and project based experiential based learning activities delivered by experienced faculty that highly value creativity in knowledge acquisition. Delivery requires 5 hours daily.
- Major/Specialization Students in grades 9-12 will select and major in any one of up to 35 majors (by the fifth year of the Academy's operation). Majors include sports, arts, technology, leadership, law, medicine, architecture, business, etc. Delivery requires 4 hours per day and instruction is provided by people who have or are making a living in each profession.
- Personal Skill Development Each week of the school year, a word or two demonstrating life values is integrated into each academic subject and into each major/specialization by the faculty.
- Career Exploration and Preparation At the beginning of each year 9th 12th grade students identify potential areas of career interest (other than their major). Then speakers who make their living in those fields come in to introduce what they look like as a careers. They also discuss what academic strengths are needed in preparation should one want to purse those careers.



MAI SPORT CURRICULUM

- MAI's 5-hour academic day is combined with a 4-hour sport/specialty training block. Its coaching/training staff are focused on a nine-month delivery schedule.
- Specific team training will feature full game/tournament schedule, technical skills development, tactical training, on-ice/field team practices, off physical conditioning, mental skills training, nutrition, and hydration guidance—all delivered within the one environment in an integrated fashion.
- Performance training at MAI will focus on long-term athletic development.
 Physical conditioning will develop speed, agility, quickness, flexibility, strength, endurance, and injury prevention.
- Mental conditioning covers focus, concentration, dealing with stress, handling adversity, performing under pressure, communication, leadership skills, etc. Add in customized nutritional guidance and hydration awareness

MAI athletes train four hours per day Mon-Fri, with additional customized training offered on Sat. Mon-Fri training includes three hours of sport specific skills/technique development and internal competition. One additional hour per day is focused on athletic performance development (i.e. physical conditioning, mental skills training, nutrition/hydration guidance, etc.). External competition schedules are determined per sport as appropriate throughout the academy school year. The timing for specific sports introduction will be dictated by the phased growth of the onsite facilities, securing access to select facilities offsite, and in partnership with existing sports providers in need of academic components.

PROPERTY OVERVIEW

PROPERTY PRESENTLY INCLUDES:

- A 313,000 sq.ft. 2 1/2 story building divided into two quads with large open learning areas, three fully-equipped workout rooms, over 40+ classrooms, a 400-seat dining room with full commercial kitchen, large student lounge and recreation/game area, space to convert into very spacious living accommodations for up to 350 students and 18 house parents, lab space for robotics, science, innovation and entrepreneurs, over 30 offices and much more. Enough space to accommodate 700 full time students and up to 300 part time participants
- A 64,000 sq.ft. building that can be used for basketball, volleyball, wrestling, fencing and some sports needing smaller facilities
- 40 acres of cleared, flat land on which to build 3^{1/2} turf soccer/lacrosse fields
- 120,000 sq. ft. pad of existing supplemental, not needed parking spaces can be used to build a two sheet ices rink/fieldhouse, additional housing and green house could be constructed


