

## Why Complete Streets in Stow?

### The Increasing Need

- Commonly requested recreational facilities in Stow include sidewalks, bike trails, bike lanes and walking trails
- Road network contains fragments of pedestrian and bike amenities



## MassDOT Complete Streets Program Certification Process

**Adopt Municipal Complete Streets Policy** 







Create Complete Streets Prioritization Plan Reimbursable through MassDOT



Tier 3

Request Up to \$400,000 Annually in Funding for Eligible Projects and Planning

## **Policy Nuts and Bolts**

**□** Project Feasibility

Describes resources and considerations to be used in determining appropriate improvements

**□** Project Exclusion

Provides for a process for excluding certain streets and a check against such action in the form of an annual report.

**□** Best Practices

Identifies current design standards to follow. Approach is context sensitive, but certain design elements must adhere to standards to gain state funding.

**☐** Implementation

Ensures relevancy by setting goals for integration of Complete Streets into planning activities, road construction schedules and other Town Documents.

### **Complete Streets Prioritization Plan**

## **Design Principles Fit for Stow**

- Minimum of 15 priority improvements outlined in plan
- Design Approach sensitive to rural community
