FOR STREET TREE PLANTINGS IN THE TOWN OF STOW**

<i>Ginkgo biloba 'Saratoga'</i>	Ginkgo 'Saratoga'
<i>Ginkgo biloba 'Shangri-la'</i>	Ginkgo 'Shangri-la'
<i>Pistacia chinensis</i>	Chinese Pistache
<i>Platanus acerifolia</i>	London Plane Tree
<i>Quercus bicolor</i>	White Oak
<i>Quercus frainetto</i>	Forset Green Oak
<i>Quercus muehlenbergii</i>	Chinkapin Oak
<i>Quercus rubra</i>	Red Oak
<i>Quercus shumardii</i>	Shumard Oak
<i>Ulmus parviflora</i>	Chinese Elm
<i>Ulmus glabara</i>	Scotch Elm
<i>Ulmus americana libertas</i>	American <u>Liberty</u> Elm
<i>Zelkova serrata 'Green Vase'</i>	Green Vase Zelkova (avoid fall planting)
<i>Zelkova serrata 'Musashino'</i>	Musashino Zelkova (only 20' branch spread)
<i>Zelkova serrata 'Village green'</i>	Village Green Zelkova

1. Avoid planting oaks and zelkovas in the fall.
2. No more than 40% of the trees planted on a single street or in a half mile area should be of the same species.
3. Spacing should depend upon mature branch spread, generally 40 to 50 feet apart for large trees.
