Tax Collector/Treasurer's Office

Real Estate and Personal Property Tax Bills for the Third Quarter <u>will be in the mail by January 1, 2024</u>, and available to be paid online by January 1, 2024. Taxes for the Third Quarter are due in the Tax Collectors' Office by February 1, 2024. Delinquency notices for prior fiscal year Real Estate and Personal Taxes have been sent out. Prior Year Bills will be subject to further action, including Tax Title if not paid by the due date.

Winter Parking Ban in Effect

Beginning December 1, parking on public ways for more than one hour at a time between the hours of 1 AM and 6 AM is prohibited on public ways in Stow. The annual parking ban will remain in effect through March 31, 2024 (Article IV, Sec. 3).

Residents whose vehicles are temporarily disabled may call the department at **978-897-4545** and notify dispatch that their vehicle will be parked overnight. They will be asked to provide contact information so they

can be reached in the event the vehicle needs to be removed if it becomes a hazard.

Conservation Department

Winter is a great time to explore new conservation properties in Stow. The ticks are fewer and the trails less crowded. The Conservation Department has just opened a new 370' boardwalk connecting the Stow Community Gardens at Captain Sargent Conservation Area to Red Acre Woodlands off South Acton Road. This hidden spot is the gateway to many miles of trails managed by the Town and Stow Conservation Trust. Have you explored Hallock Point off Sudbury Road at Lake Boon yet? How about Assabet Overlook, a short but beautiful walk along the Assabet River? Or for a longer adventure, our new Mapledale Trail along the Assabet offers a 2.5-3 mile walk around the Stow Acres South Course. The **Stow Fire Department** would like to thank all the town residents for their continuous support throughout the year. In 2023 the department

BUILDING DEPARTMENT BULLETIN

When there is storm damage to your house make sure that building permits are obtained for the work when applicable. If you have a question about whether or not your project requires permits, contact the Building Department at 978-897-2193, or visit <u>www.stow-ma.gov/building-department</u> more information.

If you install or replace a wood stove or other solid fuel burning appliance, be sure to obtain a permit from the Building Department. Once the installation is complete, we will come out and conduct an inspection of the installation.

Ensure that you have a functioning carbon monoxide (CO) detector/alarm on each level of your house. CO detectors are necessary if you burn any type of fuel to heat your house, for hot water, cooking, or clothes dryers. For questions about type and locations for CO detector you may contact either the <u>Building</u> or <u>Fire</u> Department for information and or assistance.

ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS—PUBLIC HEARING

The Zoning Board of Appeals has received the Comprehensive Permit Application for "The Residences at Stow Acres." This application is for the consideration of the development of 189 new housing units on the eastern portion of the Stow Acres North Golf Course.
