C. General Conditions Under Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act

The following conditions are only applicable to Approved projects.

- 1. Failure to comply with all conditions stated herein, and with all related statutes and other regulatory measures, shall be deemed cause to revoke or modify this Order.
- amount here. 2. The Order does not grant any property rights or any exclusive privileges; it does not authorize any injury to private property or invasion of private rights.
 - 3. This Order does not relieve the permittee or any other person of the necessity of complying with all other applicable federal, state, or local statutes, ordinances, bylaws, or regulations.
 - 4. The work authorized hereunder shall be completed within three years from the date of this Order unless either of the following apply:
 - a. The work is a maintenance dredging project as provided for in the Act; or
 - b. The time for completion has been extended to a specified date more than three years, but less than five years, from the date of issuance. If this Order is intended to be valid for more than three years, the extension date and the special circumstances warranting the extended time period are set forth as a special condition in this Order.
 - c. If the work is for a Test Project, this Order of Conditions shall be valid for no more than one year.
 - 5. This Order may be extended by the issuing authority for one or more periods of up to three years each upon application to the issuing authority at least 30 days prior to the expiration date of the Order. An Order of Conditions for a Test Project may be extended for one additional year only upon written application by the applicant, subject to the provisions of 310 CMR 10.05(11)(f).
 - 6. If this Order constitutes an Amended Order of Conditions, this Amended Order of Conditions does not extend the issuance date of the original Final Order of Conditions and the Order will expire on 1/25/2026 unless extended in writing by the Department.
 - 7. Any fill used in connection with this project shall be clean fill. Any fill shall contain no trash, refuse, rubbish, or debris, including but not limited to lumber, bricks, plaster, wire, lath, paper, cardboard, pipe, tires, ashes, refrigerators, motor vehicles, or parts of any of the foregoing.

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C. General Conditions Under Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act

- 8. This Order is not final until all administrative appeal periods from this Order have elapsed, or if such an appeal has been taken, until all proceedings before the Department have been completed.
- 9. No work shall be undertaken until the Order has become final and then has been recorded in the Registry of Deeds or the Land Court for the district in which the land is located, within the chain of title of the affected property. In the case of recorded land, the Final Order shall also be noted in the Registry's Grantor Index under the name of the owner of the land upon which the proposed work is to be done. In the case of the registered land, the Final Order shall also be noted on the Land Court Certificate of Title of the owner of the land upon which the proposed work is done. The recording information shall be submitted to the Conservation Commission on the form at the end of this Order, which form must be stamped by the Registry of Deeds, prior to the commencement of work.
- 10. A sign shall be displayed at the site not less then two square feet or more than three square feet in size bearing the words,

"Massachusetts Department	of Environmenta	I Protection	" [or, "MassDEP"]

- 11. Where the Department of Environmental Protection is requested to issue a Superseding Order, the Conservation Commission shall be a party to all agency proceedings and hearings before MassDEP.
- 12. Upon completion of the work described herein, the applicant shall submit a Request for Certificate of Compliance (WPA Form 8A) to the Conservation Commission.
- 13. The work shall conform to the plans and special conditions referenced in this order.
- 14. Any change to the plans identified in Condition #13 above shall require the applicant to inquire of the Conservation Commission in writing whether the change is significant enough to require the filing of a new Notice of Intent.
- 15. The Agent or members of the Conservation Commission and the Department of Environmental Protection shall have the right to enter and inspect the area subject to this Order at reasonable hours to evaluate compliance with the conditions stated in this Order, and may require the submittal of any data deemed necessary by the Conservation Commission or Department for that evaluation.
- 16. This Order of Conditions shall apply to any successor in interest or successor in control of the property subject to this Order and to any contractor or other person performing work conditioned by this Order.



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C. General Conditions Under Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act (cont.)

- 17. Prior to the start of work, and if the project involves work adjacent to a Bordering Vegetated Wetland, the boundary of the wetland in the vicinity of the proposed work area shall be marked by wooden stakes or flagging. Once in place, the wetland boundary markers shall be maintained until a Certificate of Compliance has been issued by the Conservation Commission.
- 18. All sedimentation barriers shall be maintained in good repair until all disturbed areas have been fully stabilized with vegetation or other means. At no time shall sediments be deposited in a wetland or water body. During construction, the applicant or his/her designee shall inspect the erosion controls on a daily basis and shall remove accumulated sediments as needed. The applicant shall immediately control any erosion problems that occur at the site and shall also immediately notify the Conservation Commission, which reserves the right to require additional erosion and/or damage prevention controls it may deem necessary. Sedimentation barriers shall serve as the limit of work unless another limit of work line has been approved by this Order.

If the work is subject to the Stormwater Standards, then the project is subject to the following conditions:

- a) All work, including site preparation, land disturbance, construction and redevelopment, shall be implemented in accordance with the construction period pollution prevention and erosion and sedimentation control plan and, if applicable, the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan required by the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System Construction General Permit as required by Stormwater Condition 8. Construction period erosion, sedimentation and pollution control measures and best management practices (BMPs) shall remain in place until the site is fully stabilized.
- b) No stormwater runoff may be discharged to the post-construction stormwater BMPs unless and until a Registered Professional Engineer provides a Certification that: *i.* all construction period BMPs have been removed or will be removed by a date certain specified in the Certification. For any construction period BMPs intended to be converted to post construction operation for stormwater attenuation, recharge, and/or treatment, the conversion is allowed by the MassDEP Stormwater Handbook BMP specifications and that the BMP has been properly cleaned or prepared for post construction operation, including removal of all construction period sediment trapped in inlet and outlet control structures; *ii.* as-built final construction BMP plans are included, signed and stamped by a Registered Professional Engineer, certifying the site is fully stabilized;

iii. any illicit discharges to the stormwater management system have been removed, as per the requirements of Stormwater Standard 10;

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C. General Conditions Under Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act (cont.)

iv. all post-construction stormwater BMPs are installed in accordance with the plans (including all planting plans) approved by the issuing authority, and have been inspected to ensure that they are not damaged and that they are in proper working condition;

v. any vegetation associated with post-construction BMPs is suitably established to withstand erosion.

- c) The landowner is responsible for BMP maintenance until the issuing authority is notified that another party has legally assumed responsibility for BMP maintenance. Prior to requesting a Certificate of Compliance, or Partial Certificate of Compliance, the responsible party (defined in General Condition 18(e)) shall execute and submit to the issuing authority an Operation and Maintenance Compliance Statement ("O&M Statement) for the Stormwater BMPs identifying the party responsible for implementing the stormwater BMP Operation and Maintenance Plan ("O&M Plan") and certifying the following:
 - i.) the O&M Plan is complete and will be implemented upon receipt of the Certificate of Compliance, and
 - ii.) the future responsible parties shall be notified in writing of their ongoing legal responsibility to operate and maintain the stormwater management BMPs and implement the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan.
- d) Post-construction pollution prevention and source control shall be implemented in accordance with the long-term pollution prevention plan section of the approved Stormwater Report and, if applicable, the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan required by the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System Multi-Sector General Permit.
- e) Unless and until another party accepts responsibility, the landowner, or owner of any drainage easement, assumes responsibility for maintaining each BMP. To overcome this presumption, the landowner of the property must submit to the issuing authority a legally binding agreement of record, acceptable to the issuing authority, evidencing that another entity has accepted responsibility for maintaining the BMP, and that the proposed responsible party shall be treated as a permittee for purposes of implementing the requirements of Conditions 18(f) through 18(k) with respect to that BMP. Any failure of the proposed responsible party to implement the requirements of Conditions 18(f) through 18(k) with respect to that BMP shall be a violation of the Order of Conditions or Certificate of Compliance. In the case of stormwater BMPs that are serving more than one lot, the legally binding agreement shall also identify the lots that will be serviced by the stormwater BMPs. A plan and easement deed that grants the responsible party access to perform the required operation and maintenance must be submitted along with the legally binding agreement.
- f) The responsible party shall operate and maintain all stormwater BMPs in accordance with the design plans, the O&M Plan, and the requirements of the Massachusetts Stormwater Handbook.



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C. General Conditions Under Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act (cont.)

- g) The responsible party shall:
 - Maintain an operation and maintenance log for the last three (3) consecutive calendar years of inspections, repairs, maintenance and/or replacement of the stormwater management system or any part thereof, and disposal (for disposal the log shall indicate the type of material and the disposal location);
 - 2. Make the maintenance log available to MassDEP and the Conservation Commission ("Commission") upon request; and
 - Allow members and agents of the MassDEP and the Commission to enter and
 inspect the site to evaluate and ensure that the responsible party is in compliance
 with the requirements for each BMP established in the O&M Plan approved by the
 issuing authority.
- h) All sediment or other contaminants removed from stormwater BMPs shall be disposed of in accordance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations.
- i) Illicit discharges to the stormwater management system as defined in 310 CMR 10.04 are prohibited.
- j) The stormwater management system approved in the Order of Conditions shall not be changed without the prior written approval of the issuing authority.
- k) Areas designated as qualifying pervious areas for the purpose of the Low Impact Site Design Credit (as defined in the MassDEP Stormwater Handbook, Volume 3, Chapter 1, Low Impact Development Site Design Credits) shall not be altered without the prior written approval of the issuing authority.
- I) Access for maintenance, repair, and/or replacement of BMPs shall not be withheld. Any fencing constructed around stormwater BMPs shall include access gates and shall be at least six inches above grade to allow for wildlife passage.

ORDER OF CONDITIONS #299-0726
Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act and Town of Stow Wetland Bylaw
Off Randall Road, Stow, MA
Assessors Map R11, Parcel 25B-3

Final Plan:

"Wetland Permitting Plan in Stow, Massachusetts For: MCO & Associates, Inc." prepared by Stamski and McNary, Inc. and signed and stamped by George Dimakarakos, dated December 20, 2022.

Findings:

The applicant has filed a Notice of Intent for work proposed within an area subject to regulation under the Wetlands Protection Act, MGL CH 131, Section 40 and the Town of Stow Wetlands Protection Bylaw and Regulations.

The proposed work includes installation of three bedrock wells and site preparation work associated with the installation, including six $8' \times 2.5' \times 2.5'$ settling pits (two at each well location). Additional wells may be installed in line with the proposed wells to meet required design flows.

At the conclusion of work, disturbed areas will be restored to the existing condition.

This work is within the 100' buffer to bordering vegetated wetlands associated with Elizabeth Brook.

No work is proposed within the 35' buffer to wetlands with the exception of discharging clean well water during pump testing. Erosion controls, consisting of straw bales and silt fence, will be installed at the 35' line which will serve as a limit of work. During the process of review of the project, the site plan was modified to move all erosion controls to or outside the 35' buffer and require additional erosion controls associated with well discharges.

The applicant has requested a partial fee waiver for the local bylaw application fee for this project as the project is occurring on a relatively small portion of a large site. The Commission approves this waiver request as it is consistent with past practice when reviewing relatively small projects on large sites.

Special Conditions:

20. A Stow Conservation Commissioner, agent of the Commission or the Department of Environmental Protection reserves the right to enter and inspect the property at all reasonable times, until a Certificate of Compliance is issued, to evaluate compliance with these conditions and to require submittal of any data deemed necessary by the Commission for that evaluation. Further, work shall be halted on the site if the Commissioner, agent or DEP determines that any of the work is not in compliance with

- this Order. Work shall not resume until the Commission is satisfied that the work will comply, and has so notified the applicant in writing.
- 21. The form provided at the end of this Order shall be completed and stamped at the Middlesex Registry of Deeds, after the expiration of the 10-day appeal period and if no request for appeal has been filed with the Department of Environmental Protection. This form shall be returned to the Commission in accordance with General Condition #8, and prior to the commencement of work.
- 22. The Stow Conservation Commission shall be notified a minimum of 72 hours prior to the start of construction and given the opportunity to inspect the erosion/sediment controls. The applicant shall advise the Commission of the name(s) and telephone numbers(s) of the person(s) responsible on site for compliance with this Order. A copy of this Order including final plans shall be on the site upon commencement and during any site work for contractors to view and adhere to. The pump test discharge locations shall be staked prior to the erosion/sediment control inspection. The Commission shall also be notified of the pump testing schedule.
- 23. All work shall be performed in accordance with the final plan as described in the Notice of Intent or as specified in this Order of Conditions. **The Commission shall be notified of any change in the location of the pits for the well pits.** Any deviation from the approved plans shall require prior approval from the Stow Conservation Commission. This may require resubmission or modification of the Notice of Intent
- 24. No filling of land beyond the limits or above the grades on the submitted plans is authorized.
- 25. Sediment and erosion control devices shall consist of straw bales and silt fence and shall be installed between the proposed wells and the wetland, and downgradient of the discharge points from the drilling and air yield testing, and shall be maintained during work. A second line of erosion controls at proposed well three should be added to further protect the resource area from erosion and sedimentation. These sediment controls shall serve as a limit of work and no activity, including stockpiling or storage of material, is permitted beyond the sediment controls. Extra erosion controls shall be stockpiled on site, and check dams installed as necessary to slow overland flow and prevent sediment-laden water from reaching resource areas.
- 26. All water and slurry from the well drilling process shall be discharged in accordance with the methodology described in the application. Erosion controls shall be placed around the downgradient side of the mud pits. No water or slurry from well drilling or air yield testing shall be discharged in the 35' buffer. Water from the pump test shall be discharged into Elizabeth Brook without causing erosion in the buffer or to the river bank.
- 27. The culvert connecting the southern wetland to Wheeler Pond shall be protected from damage when mobilizing the drill rig to proposed well location 1.

- 28. Tree pruning for access to proposed well 3 should be done using clean cuts.
- 29. Concrete wash-out water shall not be discarded within the 100' buffer or within 100' of any drainage system that may discharge to wetlands. All washout materials will be managed with an appropriate BMP. If concrete is spilled during construction, spilled materials shall be removed from the buffer zone or resource areas and properly disposed of.
- 30. The areas of construction shall remain in a stable condition at the close of each construction day. Sediment and erosion controls shall be inspected at this time, and repaired or reinforced or replaced as necessary.
- 31. The contractor shall notify the Conservation Commission when work is complete. Any areas disturbed for construction shall be loamed and seeded with an appropriate seed mix and the area allowed to restore naturally. The contractor shall address any unplanned discharge to wetlands and notify the Conservation Commission of the release immediately.
- 32. There shall be no storage of chemicals, oil, fuel, fertilizer, or other potentially hazardous materials associated with the project with the exception of fuel for generators which shall be placed on a spill prevention tarp. A spill clean up kit shall be kept on premises during the work and any spill reported to DEP and the Conservation Commission.
- 33. All waste and excavated material shall be disposed of in accordance with applicable laws.
- 34. Upon completion of this project, the applicant shall submit the following to the Stow Conservation Commission to receive a Certificate of Compliance.
 - a. A letter from the applicant's engineering confirming that the work was done in accordance with the approved plan and requesting a Certificate of Compliance
 - b. Photographs of the completed work.

F. Appeals

The applicant, the owner, any person aggrieved by this Order, any owner of land abutting the land subject to this Order, or any ten residents of the city or town in which such land is located, are hereby notified of their right to request the appropriate MassDEP Regional Office to issue a Superseding Order of Conditions. The request must be made by certified mail or hand delivery to the Department, with the appropriate filing fee and a completed Request for Departmental Action Fee Transmittal Form, as provided in 310 CMR 10.03(7) within ten business days from the date of issuance of this Order. A copy of the request shall at the same time be sent by certified mail or hand delivery to the Conservation Commission and to the applicant, if he/she is not the appellant.

Any appellants seeking to appeal the Department's Superseding Order associated with this appeal will be required to demonstrate prior participation in the review of this project. Previous participation in the permit proceeding means the submission of written information to the Conservation Commission prior to the close of the public hearing, requesting a Superseding Order, or providing written information to the Department prior to issuance of a Superseding Order.

The request shall state clearly and concisely the objections to the Order which is being appealed and how the Order does not contribute to the protection of the interests identified in the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act (M.G.L. c. 131, § 40), and is inconsistent with the wetlands regulations (310 CMR 10.00). To the extent that the Order is based on a municipal ordinance or bylaw, and not on the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act or regulations, the Department has no appellate jurisdiction.
